"As humans, we know what our rights are and know what we deserve and we are willing to fight for this. Over time, the fight for human rights has not stopped, and it gives hope for the future," she said.

Catherine said to her race has never been something which she felt divided her from the community, be it at school or church.

"We can't deny the heritage of each race because that's who we are as people. I live in a community where people make the effort to understand each other and their cultures, and that's what it should be like in the county and in the world," she said.
